

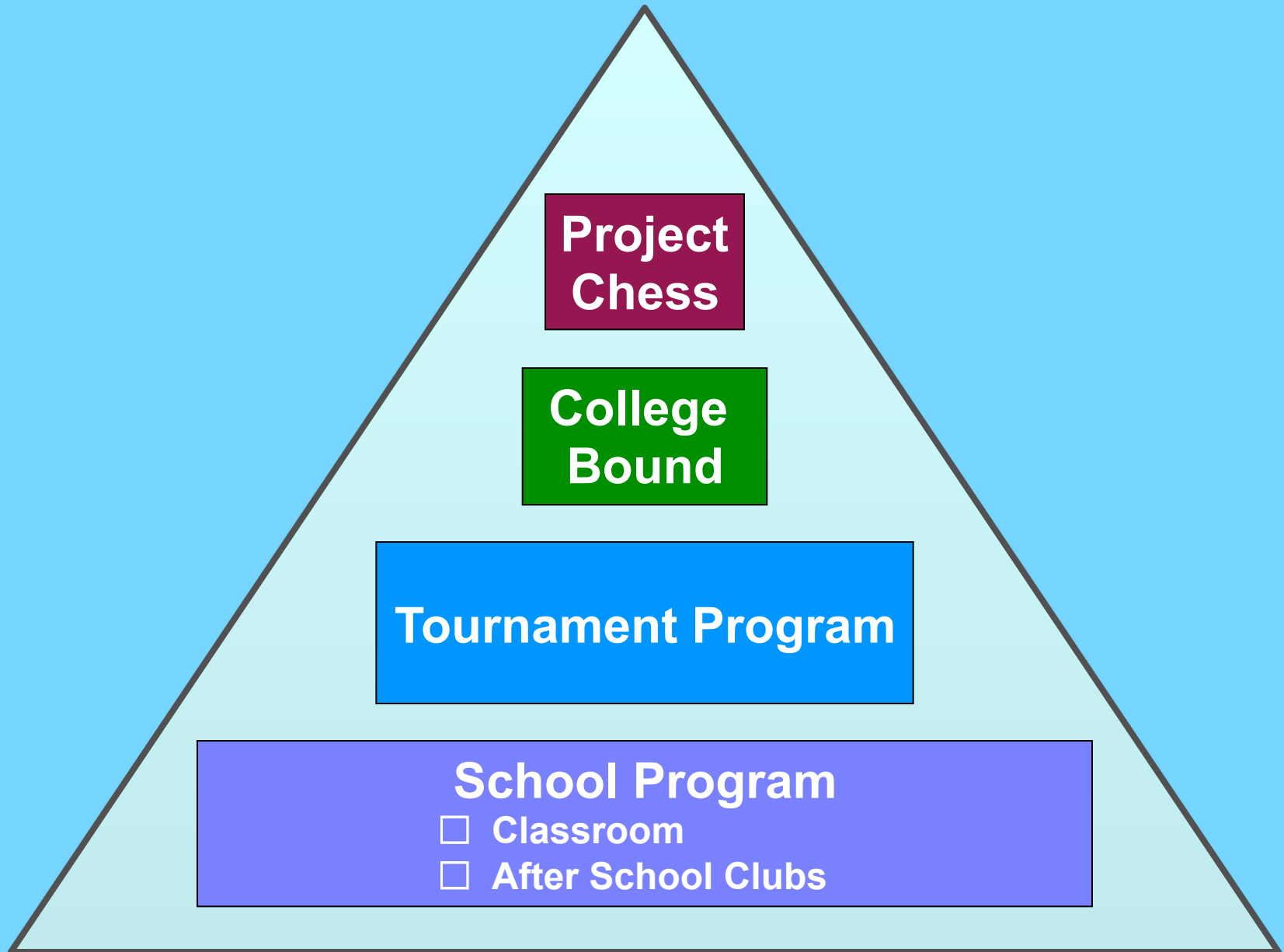

# Chess-in-the-Schools: Our Students

47% Latino  
39% African American  
9% Multiracial  
3% Asian  
2% Caucasian



98% of our students come from economically disadvantaged families

# Chess-in-the-Schools: The School Program

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Students learn to play chess as part of their classroom curriculum.



After-school chess clubs continue the instruction.



Summer chess camps.

- 13,000 students
- 50 schools
- Starting in 3rd grade

# Chess-in-the-Schools: Scholastic Tournament Program

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Tournaments are organized to ensure students are challenged and encouraged.



- 26 annual scholastic tournaments
- 400 to 900 students per tournament based on venue



Teams compete in city, state, national and international tournaments.



- 25 to 90 students per team

# Chess-in-the-Schools: Project Chess

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Project Chess is designed to increase the number of public school educators who can effectively teach chess in their classrooms and after-school chess clubs.

- Teacher Training Institute
- Follow-up support
- Scholastic tournaments
